

**Patriots
(Part Two)**

Taken from Cultura Cubana - Matanzas

Campuzano y Lamadrid (Pio D.) -- Patriot from Matanzas, son of Pío Campuzano, professor o the Secondary School La Espresa. He was a passionate orator and journalist, and one of the first conspirators in the time leading up to the second war of Cuban independence.

Cardenal (Teodoro) -- Distinguished lawyer, also from Matanzas, today residing in La Habana. He was born in the city of dos Ríos, in 1865. He emigrated during the last war of Cuban independence, working actively on the Cuban Committee of Paris from 1896 to 1898, with the Doctors Betances and J. B. Puyans, Domingo Figarola Caneda, Doctor Groso, Doctor Ezequiel García Enseñat, Ventura, and the ladies Barbarroza, and Nicolasa de Cárdenas, etc., etc.

Carnot (Alfredo) -- Senator from Matanzas and patriot. He is a doctor of dental surgery and conspired for the freedom of Cuba during the first war when very young and in the years prior to the second war.

Cartaya (Eliseo) -- Was born in 1858, in Matanzas. He lent his services to the cause of Cuba, organizing and accompanying expeditions to distribute arms and provisions to the revolutionaries. He was assistant to General Emilio Núñez and ended the war with the rank of major of the Cuban Liberation Army. He returned to Cuba with the expeditionary army of the United States in 1898.

Casanova de Villaverde (Emilia) -- Cultured and enthusiastic patriot from Cárdenas, wife of novelist D. Cirilo Villaverde. She did much for the cause of

the country and fought the Spanish government with courageous integrity. She had to migrate to the United States for her revolutionary ideas and, there, was very helpful to the Cuban refugees committed to the insurrectionist movement of Agüero and López.

At the end of 1869, she wrote to Garibaldi about the insurrection of Carlos Manuel de Céspedes and on January 31, 1870, the famous Italian general wrote the following letter from Caprena to the Cuban patriot:

My dear Lady,

With all my soul I have been with you from the beginning of this glorious revolution. It is not only Spain who fights for liberty at home, and enslaves the countries abroad. I will always be with the oppressed, be it kings or nations who oppress them

Affectionately,

G. Garibaldi.

The patriot Emilia Casanova was born on the 18th of January 1832. The exact date of her death is not known.

Castro y Lajonchérę (Ernesto) -- Lawyer and patriot from Cárdenas. He was one of the first conspirators in that city to work, in 1895, for the ideals of the Cuban people. Denounced to the Spanish authorities, Señor Castro immediately joined the insurrection, until illnesses contracted in the campaign, forced him to leave for the United States in search of relief.

Dantín (Clemente) -- Valiant general of the Liberation Army who fought in the Matanzas territory under the command of General Pedro E. Betancourt and General Eduardo García in the second war. He took up arms in May of 1895. He was a half-breed of humble class, whose true surname was Valdés, originally from Candelaria.

Delgado (Joaquín María) -- Born in Matanzas in the year 1822, he died in

1888, in Germany. He was a distinguished patriot who did much for the cause of Cuba, suffering deportation to Spain. He financed the printing of *Histórica de Cuba* by his friend Pedro J. Gutiéras. The Spanish government condemned him to death for his support of the expeditionary organizations, buying of arms, etc., but Delgado stayed in the United States until his death.

Delgado (Ricardo) -- Nephew of the previous Delgado, he was an engineer. Born in Matanzas the 6th of January 1867, he died in December 1897, fighting against Spanish forces that surprised him when he was already wounded. He fought under the command of Maceo, distinguishing himself for his heroic valor and daring feats.

Diago y de Cárdenas, (Fernando) -- Colonel of the Liberation Army, he belonged to a distinguished family of La Havana. He interrupted his law career to join the revolution in November 1895, becoming a member of the forces of General Serafín Sánchez in the province of Santa Clara and took part in several combats.

Later, when General Máximo Gómez ordered that several elements of the army were to go to the eastern or western forces, depending of their place of origin, Señor Diago decided to go to La Habana to join the forces of General José M. Aguirre. But on his way through the province of Matanzas, in April 1896, he met General Pedro E. Betancourt engaged in combat.

Betancourt suggested that he remain as first adjutant and Diago accepted, staying in the province of Matanzas until the end of the campaign. He was also interim chief of state for General Betancourt until the arrival of Dr. Rossell Malpica, who had been promised the post previously.

After the death of Rossell Malpica, Colonel Diago took his place at headquarters until the end of the war, helping with all the combats, including that of Purgatorio which was very important for the end results of the campaign in Matanzas. Colonel Diago earned all his promotions strictly "by the book" through actions of war, always demonstrating courage and uncommon ability.

Once Cuba was free, he did not ask for compensation for having sacrificed the best years of his young life.

Domenech y Gener (Gerardo M.) -- One of the most colorful figures in the

history of Cuban independence! He was born in Jovellanos, on May 27, 1867, to an illustrious family of patriots and heroes, who were not able to give him the education that his intelligence required, due to the economic uneasiness caused to all social classes by the political events of the day.

He joined the conspiracy in *Cayo Hueso* (Key West) and then in Matanzas where the name Gerardo Domenech is joined with the first conspirators. He gave great service to the Cuban cause, taking part in risky projects transporting arms, important documents, supplies, money, etc. from one side of the province to the other, and always giving proof of his courage and calmness.

On the nights of the 23rd and 24th of February 1895, he went alone to pick up, at the *Estación Benavides*, arms and ammunition, taking them to the appointed place.

In 1895, he performed a delicate mission in New York, with the Cuban Delegation, and when he wanted to leave the United States he tried three times without success, only on the fourth try was he was able to leave. He came with the expedition that landed in Nuevitas on March 19, 1896, joining with the revolutionary forces of General Rodriguez. There were only eight men, who had great difficulties to overcome to unload the arms and supplies they brought with them. Domenech, a true athlete, carried a cannon on his back, taking it from the beach to the forest.

He later became adjutant to General D. Francisco Carrillo, but when General Rodriguez needed to form a mobile force, Gerardo asked to be part of it and commanded an battalion of infantry. At the end of 1896, he was wounded in Mabugina while fighting forces of superior number. The bullet entered his chest and went out near his spine, leaving him in critical condition, his legs paralyzed.

In this condition of immobility, he directed 12 men who transported him through the fields in an improvised stretcher. Domenech supported Weyler's campaign, without any medicine and sometimes without water, food or morphine for the atrocious pain he was suffering. This group of men carried him from place to place until they arrived at a place of safety.

He later went abroad to have medical treatment, but the wound and the suffering had aged him prematurely. In February 1898, señorita Ana Mercedes Gener, a noble Cuban lady, who had loved Domenech as a patriot and a soldier, married him to become his devoted nurse for 18 years. Commandant Domenech died on the 30th of November 1916.

José Martí, General Carrillo, Flor Crombet, José María Rodríguez, José Francisco Lamadrid, and many other illustrious patriots had a special regard for Domenech, as stated in the many letters that his wife kept as valuable mementos.

Dominguez (Emilio) -- Civil engineer, originally from Matanzas, and a distinguished patriot. He was born on January 9, 1839, and died on November 7, 1913. He took part in the conspiracy during the first war and was also part in the expedition *Lillian*, which failed in 1869, when she ran aground on a key. Two years before the start of the second war, he conspired again with Domenech; Pedro E. Betancourt, P. Moinelo, Tomás F. López, Pedro Duarte, Juan Gualberto Gómez, etc. They met in *Calle Daoiz*, in the house number 57.

The engineer Dominguez was one of the delegates named by Martí in the province of Matanzas. He traveled to Philadelphia in 1895, returning to Cuba in March 1896, with the expedition of Calixto García.

He was taken prisoner in August 1897, and was locked in the *Castillo de San Severino*, where his wife, señora Pilar González, also suffered several days of harsh confinement in a dungeon.

Señor Dominguez has been a patriot of firm conviction always very honorable in his political and revolutionary actions.

Dominguez Roldán (Francisco)-- The present secretary of public education is not only an eminent radiologist, but also a distinguished patriot, whose actions in the last war of independence merit mention.

He was born in La Habana in 1864, the 15th of February. He joined the revolution in February of 1896, in Cárdenas, and, being part of the local *Junta Revolucionaria*, left the city with important documents. He camped in Recreo, and then went to visit General Gómez, whose forces he joined. He was soon given the responsibility of organizing reinforcements and collecting money to buy arms.

Dr. Dominguez Roldán met the correspondent of *The Journal of New York*, Mr. G. Flintz, who joined the forces of General Gómez. The North-American journalist later wrote a series of articles that were part of the work *En Marcha con Gómez*.

Roldán was named governor of the Occidental provinces (Pinar del Río, Habana and Matanzas) and gave great service organizing hospitals and

local offices, appointing lieutenant governors of districts, and taking care of the wounded at the same time. He established the main hospital near Ceiba Mocha, on a hill called La Cámara. His organization did not reach Pinar del Río, due to later arrangements made by the insurgent government.

Dr. Dominguez Roldán worked first with General Carlos M. Rojas, in Ojo de Agua in the *Valle of Guanacaro*, and at the sugar mill, *Julta*. After that he was with Lacret Morlot for a long time, contributing to several expeditions, including those of the *Trujillo* and the *Collazo*, which by error put ashore in Varadero instead of in La Cámara, provoking an attack by the Spanish troops guarding that place.

Lastly he worked with General Betancourt who is happy to recall the work of Colonel Dominguez Roldán and his aides, Colonel Enrique Armando del Junco and General Clemente Gómez, for their care of the wounded. When General Mario G. Menocal was named chief of the Fifth Corps, Colonel Dominguez Roldán met him and accompanied him to the sugar mill, *Averhoff*.

Dominguez (Pio) -- Lieutenant colonel of the Liberation Army, he operated in the territory of Matanzas, taking part in some very important battles, among them the famous action of Jicarita.

Duarte (Pedro) -- Originally of Matanzas, born on the 29th of June 1855. He was one of the most zealous conspirators, and pursued only the ideal of the independence of the country. He took part in the organization of the expedition, *Virginius*, whose crew was taken prisoner and, many of them, shot to death in Santiago de Cuba in the years 1873.

From then on he served the cause of Cuba with the same love and he was one of the first conspirators in Matanzas, in 1892. In 1895, at the start of the war, Martí sent him to Tampa where he was named president of the Council of the Cuban Revolutionary Party, until the end of the war.

Today, Señor Duarte lives modestly in La Habana, wanting no compensation for his services to the country, as in the yeras he served.

Carlos Manuel de Cespedes, a biography.

Carlos Manuel de Cespedes y del Castillo was born on April 18, 1819, in Bayamo, Oriente, Cuba and was baptized on April 26, 1819, in the parish of San Salvador, Bayamo. He was educated, first, at the *Convento de Nuestro Señor San Francisco* in Bayamo, where he studied Latin and grammar. Then in the *Convento de Santo Domingo* where he studied logic and ethics. Later, he went to Havana and was admitted to the *Real y Conciliar Colegio Seminario de San Carlos y San Ambrosio* and the *Real y Pontificia Universidad de San Gerónimo de La Habana* where, on March 22, 1838, he obtained a degree of bachelor of *Derecho Civil* [civil law].

Cespedes married his first cousin, Maria del Carmen de Cespedes y del Castillo in April, 1839, in Bayamo. Maria, who was born in about 1820, was the daughter of Francisco Jose de Céspedes y Luque, *comandante* [commander or major] *de la Milicias Blancas Disciplinadas de Cuba y Bayamo*, and Catalina López del Castillo y Ramirez de Aguilar.

On January 3, 1840, Maria del Carmen gave birth to their first child, Carlos Manuel, but just six months later, Cespedes traveled to Spain, where he remained for two years. There, he received a bachelor of law degree from the University of Barcelona and a doctorate of law from the University of Madrid. In Spain, he had his first taste of revolution, when he became involved in an uprising against the Spanish government! He was deported from Spain after the uprising failed and travelled, for some time, through Europe learning English, French, and Italian on the way.

On July 27, 1842, he returned to Cuba aboard the frigate *Silfide* and made his way to Bayamo, where, in 1844, he

opened a law practice and was named *síndico del Ayuntamiento* [liquidator of bankruptcies for the city council] *de Bayamo*.

Law soon gave way to politics, however, as a strong anti-Spanish movement began to develop in Cuba. In 1851, there was an invasion of Cuba led by the Venezuelan General Narciso López. The invasion failed and López was executed by the Spanish.

Cespedes "burst into" a banquet given by the governor to celebrate the failure of López and loudly condemned the affair as being in bad taste and, carried away by anger, let fall certain phrases which revealed his sympathy for the beaten invasion. Arrested because of his anti-Spanish statements, confined for five months in *El Morro de Santiago*, and banished from Bayamo, Cespedes took up residence in Manzanillo where he wrote poetry and articles about chess, resumed his career as a lawyer, became interested in the business of agriculture, but, above all, began to conspire with leaders in Bayamo and many of the other areas of Oriente to revolt against Spain and secure a free, independent, Cuba.

In 1866, he purchased *La Demajagua*, one of the oldest sugar mills in Manzanillo, near the village of Yara, for 81 thousand pesos, and within a year had rebuilt it into a highly successful operation. He and María del Carmen had two more children, Oscar and María del Carmen, but on January 19, 1868, María del Carmen died of consumption [tuberculosis].

In April, 1868, Cespedes founded the Masonic lodge, *Buena Fe*, in Manzanillo which became, as they had in Bayamo, Las Tunas, and elsewhere in Oriente, hotbeds of revolutionary unrest.

In 1868, Queen Isabella was forced from the throne of Spain and Cespedes called for immediate revolutionary action, claiming that "... the power of Spain is decrepit and worm-eaten. If it still appears strong and great it is because for more than three centuries we have regarded it from our knees. Let us rise!" Some of the conspirators wanted to wait until they were better armed and organized but on October 8, 1868, the Spanish General, Lersundy, having heard of the

planned revolt, sent a telegram to the Governor of Bayamo ordering the arrest of Carlos Manuel de Cespedes, Pedro Figueredo, Francisco Vicente Aguilera, Francisco Maceo Osorio, Bartolomé Masó, and Francisco Javier de Cespedes, leaders of the revolutionary committees in Manzanillo and Bayamo.

The telegraphist of Bayamo, Ismael de Cespedes intercepted the telegram and sent the information to Carlos Manuel de Cespedes who, on October 10, 1868, issued the historic *Grito de Yara* from his plantation, *La Demajagua*, proclaiming Cuba's independence. He freed his slaves and incorporated them into his disorganized and ill-armed force and made public a manifesto explaining the causes of the revolt.

Candelaria (Cambula) Acosta Fontaine, the daughter of Juan Acosta, the foreman of *La Demajagua*, was 17 years old in 1868. On the day that Carlos Manuel de Cespedes issued the *Grito de Yara*, she sewed the first flag of Cuba, using material from a blue dress, a piece of white fabric, and part of a mosquito net which was made of red cloth. This flag, today, hangs in the Room of the Flags, in the Museum of the City of Havana.

Cambula and Carlos Manuel had, it seems, been lovers for some time prior to the death of Carlos' wife, María del Carmen, and of this relationship were born Carmen and Manuel. On December 7, 1866, Carlos Manuel wrote a poem telling of his love for *La China*, which we believe is dedicated to Cambula.

Cambula left Cuba for Jamaica while pregnant with Manuel but they wrote to each other for many years, and Carlos wrote fondly about her in his diary, almost up until the day he was killed. In January 1874, Cespedes sent Francisco Vélez to Jamaica with a package for Cambula. The package contained letters and ounces of gold, *un rizo de sus cabellos y un mechón de sus barbas para los gemelos* [a curl of his hair and a lock of his beard for the twins]. The ship on which

Vega sailed was shipwrecked and Cespedes' package never reached Cambula.

Cambula returned to Cuba many years later, after the death of Cespedes.

The issuance of the *Grito de Yara* was followed by the organization of a provisional government with Cespedes as commander-in-chief of the army and head of the government. It was agreed that Bayamo would be the first to be taken and on October 17, 1868, Cespedes met with his staff to plan the attack. He sent an emissary to the Governor Udaeta in Bayamo to inform him that they were going to attack the town and to give him the opportunity to surrender. Flora Mora wrote: *El Gobernador le contesto verbalmente, por medio del mismo emisario, que preferia la muerte a la rendicion.* [The governor answered him verbally, by means of the same emissary, who claimed that he would prefer to die rather than to surrender].

Udaeta put his guards on alert and issued a decree that all who helped the enemy would be executed. An hour later, the revolutionaries rode through the city, distributing their own publication, encouraging its citizens to take up their weapons against the Spanish.

The insurrectionists took the city of Bayamo on October 20, 1868, and held it until January, 1869, when the Spanish general, Valmaseda appeared with a large force. Holguin was taken and several smaller town and plantations were taken and lost. The rebel force grew to nearly 20,000, many being slaves freed either voluntarily or by force.

Despite their initial success, the rebels were never able to advance further west than Puerto Principe. They remained strong in the east but failed altogether to gain active support in the prosperous west. The Spanish regained control of most of the cities and towns and the rebels, living off the land, remained in the more remote

regions of the country, avoiding direct contact with the enemy, and maintaining control of the countryside.

Cespedes' almost absolute power as well as his failure to decree the immediate abolition of slavery caused opposition within the revolutionary ranks and, facing mounting pressure, he called for a constitutional convention to establish a more democratic provisional government. Delegates from several eastern towns met at Guaimaro on April 10, 1869, and adopted a constitution that provided for a *Cámara de Representantes* [house of representatives] with Cespedes president of the republic and Manuel de Quesada commander-in-chief of the army.

In May, Cespedes wrote to President Ulysses Grant asking that the US recognize his government but recognition was never granted. Colombia, Mexico, and several other Latin American republics did demonstrate their solidarity with the revolutionary movement but it was the recognition of the US that Cespedes needed to legitimize his position.

On November 4, 1869, despite his apparent passion for Candelaria Acosta, Carlos Manuel married Ana María de Quesada y Loináz,¹ daughter of Pedro Manuel de Quesada y Quesada and Carmen Loináz y Miranda,² in the parish of San Diego del Chorrillo, Camagüey, Cuba. Ana was born on February 14, 1842, and was

educated at the *Convento de las Ursulinas* where she learned embroidery and lace work. She was the sister of Manuel de Quesada, the new commander-in-chief of the army.

They had three children: Oscar, Gloria, and Carlos-Manuel. In 1871, Ana María, pregnant with twins Gloria and Carlos-Manuel, left Cuba for the safety of New York. She set out with the *bayames* poet, Juan Clemente Zenea, but they were stopped by Spanish authorities not far from the *Bahía* [bay] *de Yabinal*, to the north of Camaguey, where they were to board the boat for the USA. Ana was taken to Havana but on January 12, 1871, was allowed to continue her journey.

The twins were born in New York in August 1871, but Carlos-Manuel, the father, died on February 27, 1874, in San Lorenzo, Oriente, having never seen them. Ana returned to Cuba many years later but died and was buried in Paris in 1910.

The war dragged on with neither side achieving many notable success. Cespedes agreed to the burning of sugar plantations in the east to apply economic pressure on Spain, but plans to apply this tactic to the western parts of Cuba were rejected as were proposals to expand the war with an invasion of the west itself. A large number of rebel leaders were killed and many fled from Cuba to Jamaica. Some accepted Spanish offers of clemency and simply stopped fighting.

Cespedes' handling of the war and the failure of his government to take a firm stand on the question as to whether slaves would be freed should the Spanish be overthrown, cost him support and on October 27, 1873, the *Cámara de Representantes*, at a meeting held at Bijagual, voted to remove Cespedes from the office of president to be succeeded by Salvador Cisneros Betancourt. In November, Cespedes applied for a passport so that he could leave Cuba and join Ana and the children in New York and on, January 23, 1874, he retired to San Lorenzo in the Sierra Maestras, accompanied by his

son, Carlos Manuel de Cespedes y Cespedes, until the passport should arrive.

In San Lorenzo, Carlos Manuel met the widow, Francisca (Panchita) Rodriguez. Carlos Manuel and Panchita became lovers and produced a son, Manuel Francisco. Many years later, Panchita lived in Palma Soriano, near Santiago de Cuba, with Manuel Francisco, who related that Panchita had made a living going from house to house with a horse and two saddlebags full of threads, cotton and other goods.

Cespedes' passport never arrived and on February 27, 1874,³ he was ambushed and killed by soldiers of *Batallón de San Quintín* near San Lorenzo. It is believed that he was betrayed to the Spanish by a servant.

German Arciniegas, in his book, *Caribbean Sea of the New World* gives the following account of his death:

"... like the day in 1874, when Cespedes ordered his horse *Telemaco* saddled and set off for the village of San Lorenzo to give the children their lessons in reading and writing. Cespedes had been obliged to abandon his command and take refuge in the hills, but he was still the great gentleman as he rode along on his spirited horse, in his velvet waistcoat and with his six-shooter. The Spaniards surprised him and fired upon him. Cespedes defended himself as he retired along the edge of a ravine, firing his bullets one by one and saving the last for himself. He had said on one occasion: 'I pray that God will give me the courage to die with the dignity befitting a Cuban, although I do not think the occasion will arise, for my revolver has six shots, five for the Spaniards and one for myself.' But he did not have time to use it. Brigido Verdecia's bullet pierced his heart and Cespedes'

body rolled down the ravine. When they recovered it there was still one shot in his revolver."

His body was taken to Santiago de Cuba and was later interred in the *Cementerio de Santa Ifigenia* in that city.
