Jane Landers is Associate Professor of History and former Associate Dean of the College of Arts & Science and Director of the Center for Latin American and Iberian Studies at Vanderbilt University. She is the author of the award-winning book Black Society in Spanish Florida (Urbana, 1999), editor of Colonial Plantations and Economy of Florida (Gainesville, 2000) and Against the Odds: Free Blacks in the Slave Societies of the Americas (London, 1996), and co-editor of Slaves, Subjects and Subversives: Blacks in Colonial Latin America (Albuquerque, 2006) and The African American Heritage of Florida (Gainesville, 1995). Landers is currently working on two monographs -- one about Atlantic Creoles in the age of revolutions and a second on maroon communities around the Spanish Caribbean.
